    - How can we as parents aid in staffing shortages?
      - Spread the word
      - Utilizing current social media platforms like Instagram and linked in

      - More effort into supporting new teachers in an effort to retain qualified teachers
      - Record number of intern teachers for next school year
      - 1/5th of teachers in ASDE are in their first 3 years of their career.
      - More flexible teaching positions (co-teaching, part-time, etc.)
      - Allowing retirees to continue to work without it affecting their pension

- Supply List
  - The supply list has grown substantially
  - We now have a 96% fill rate for absences
- Enrollment
  - ASDE is adding between 50-100 new students a month
  - Largest portion of incoming students are international
- ASDE Recruiting for a variety of roles
  - We need people to fill a variety of roles (EAs, bus drivers, behavior mentors, social workers, SLPs, etc.)
- Compensation
  - Atlantic Canada is behind the rest of the country
  - Our benefits are quality of life, lower prices for real estate
- Provincial Math assessment
  - The assessment tool doesn't match school records
  - Improving common ongoing assessments
    - We can start interventions now rather than waiting on summative assessments
- 3. School Improvement Plan Update
  - School Improvement Plan (SIP) poster created to flesh out plan for "all students shall be at grade level for numeracy" goal.
  - Math leads have been meeting and modeling with staff
  - Students receiving extra phys ed time with gym leads from district so teachers can implement new math strategies

# 4. ESS Report

- Debra Lee Pollard, Acting Vice Principal, reported on ESS
- The AHM ESS team are all new to their roles
- New ESS structures put in place
  - o Calling for walk by, assist or team
    - When teachers are in a situation with a disruptive student or if a situation arises where assistance is needed, teachers can make a call requesting aid from ESS.
      - Walk by: ESS team member walks by classroom, waits in the wings.
      - Assist: ESS team member on call comes into classroom and asks what is needed.
      - Team: entire ESS team reports to classroom

- Team with Medical: Ms Brine (phys ed teacher) is replaced by Wendy White and administers first aid
- Referral Process
  - They have updated the process for bringing concerns to ESS.
  - First step is meeting with their grade level team (PLC)
    - They have altered the PLC meeting template so there is less focus on student concerns.
    - The hope is that those student concerns will make their way to ESS so that PLC meetings can be more solution focused instead of issue focused.
- CSO (Collaborative Sharing Opportunities)
  - Instead of having a ESS team member at each PLC meeting, teachers will meet monthly with ESS for a CSO.
  - Teachers will share their updates in regards to the SIP goals.
